If children themselves participate in puppet theaters, they will understand more clearly what such feelings are. We educate children by explaining values perfectly. For example, not to spoil bread is one of the most beautiful values of our people.

It is no secret to us that some children bite off bread and throw it on the ground or throw it away. In such situations, there is no need to shout at the child, hit him or fight him, in which case he will still repeat the same thing because he will not understand why he should not do this. In such situations, it is necessary to properly explain to him that bread is the most precious blessing that our people value, and that it is a sin to waste it, even if it is explained through various narrations, fairy tales, hadiths, and if possible, games, but the child will have a sufficient understanding of this. By considering bread as precious and valuable, moral education is also formed in the child. Based on this, when the child picks up the bread, he remembers the fairy tale he heard, the game he played, and he tries not to do it again. Carefully preserving the rich cultural heritage left to us by our ancestors, creatively enriching it with the achievements of modern science, shaping

the minds of future generations with national and universal values, and increasing their creative activity is the main guarantee of strengthening the foundation of independence. A.
